Tolerates dry and alkaline soils. Grows well in shade and adapts to containers. Recommended street tree for under utility lines, between streets and sidewalks.

Acer japonicum	Maple	Fernleaf Japanese Green	Small tree growing 15 feet. Multi-divided and deeply cut leaves offering a fern like appearance. Spectacular scarlet red shades in the fall.
Acer miyabei	Maple	State Street	Height 40 feet, spread 25 feet. Dark green exquisite foliage and interesting dark gray corky bark. Excellent ornamental character and good adaptability to a broad range of conditions. Very tolerant of heat, drought, salt and pollution. Can be used as a shade or street tree.
Acer palmatum	Maple	Atrolineare Red Japanese	The deciduous foliage is dark, black-red in spring washing out some in the summer. Leaves are very narrow and string like. Fall color is brilliant red. Grows to 12 feet high by 10 feet wide.
Acer palmatum	Maple	Beni Hime	Flushing early in spring; the tiny, green leaves have pinkish orange margins. Spring leaves turn solid green in the summer only to have the multitone colors return again for the fall. This unique dwarf is popular with bonsai enthusiasts and is an ideal patio tree. Full sun.
